Randy Schneider and Charles Daldry reported on the Teller House clock cleaning and repair completed for the hotel in Central City Colorado. Several members participated. The clock has been in the foyer for many decades. No one on the premises remembered when it last held a beat. It was speculated it had not kept accurate time for thirty years maybe more. An inscription inside the case documented that the clock was "Brought from New York by Ox-cart in 1865" and probably donated to the Teller House in the 1930's or 40's. In many ways it was in exceptional condition. The verge was jeweled. The pendulum contains mercury similar to the clock at Chamberlin Observatory belonging to the University of Denver.



The quarterly workshop entitled "Riveting and Soldering" was held at Emily Griffith School on April 13. Participants gave the day high marks thanks to presenters Ken Reindel and Jack Wood. Thanks to these folks and Dick Shelton for planning and organizing to make quarterly workshops a reality. The next workshop is scheduled for July followed by a final seminar in October.
